NEWS REVIEW

CREMATORIA NEWS

Welwyn Hatfield Borough Council has been granted planning permission to build a new crematorium at Southway, Hatfield. You can find full details of the proposed development on the <u>Welwyn Hatfield Borough Council website</u>, using the planning application number 6/2019/1208/MAJ.

Westerleigh Group's appeal against the refusal of planning permission for a new crematorium in Shropshire, has been rejected by a planning inspector. Shropshire Council's planning committee rejected the plan last year. Westerleigh Group appealed the decision but planning inspector Thomas Hatfield has rejected the appeal, saying he agreed with RAF concerns that the plan would have an adverse impact on the defence site. An application has been submitted by Mr Jonathan Crossley, to **East Lindsey District Council** for the development of a new crematorium, which will also feature a chapel, memorial garden and associated facilities, including car parking. According to the planning application, the proposed facility would 'fit in' with its surroundings and the crematorium building would be 'low rise', meaning it would only be visible from the main road. Antrim and Newtownabbey Borough Council have confirmed that the proposed crematorium at Doagh Road, Newtownabbey, has been progressed, during a remote meeting of Borough Council councillors. A spokesman for the Council said: "The decision was taken to progress to the procurement stage for the proposed crematorium at the Doagh Road site." CREMATORIA NEWS

Cremations will no longer take place at council-run Poole Crematorium. **Bournemouth, Christchurch and Poole Council** said funeral services would still be held at Poole Crematorium but that from Monday 13 April, cremations would be carried out in Bournemouth. The move has been described as "a devastating blow" for the community. For more on this story, please read the <u>Bournemouth Echo article</u>.

Work to upgrade **Stourbridge Crematorium** is to be postponed due to the coronavirus outbreak. The £2 million project, which was due to get underway this spring, is now expected to go ahead later in the year. Councillor Ian Kettle, Dudley's cabinet member responsible for bereavement services, said: "The work at Stourbridge Crematorium was due to take place in the next few weeks but given the ongoing coronavirus pandemic we are looking to push the work back to later in the year." Efford Crematorium in Plymouth which was shut after a fire on New Year's Eve is to reopen with new rules in place for mourners due to coronavirus. A statement from Plymouth City Council said: "Repairs have finished and funeral directors are being advised that the crematorium will now be available for services as well as the facility at Weston Mill." Hambleton District Council has submitted a planning application for the development of a new crematorium to be built near Skipton on Swale, Thirsk. Horizon Cremation has submitted a planning application for the development of a new crematorium to be built on land off Oxted Road, **Tandridge**. The application follows a public exhibition on the proposed crematorium. INTERNATIONAL NEWS

The Algarve's first crematorium has opened in Albufeira, with plans to carry out over 2,000 cremations a year. "There was a huge need for a cremation chamber in the Algarve as it was the only region in the country that did not have one yet," Paula Ganhão, managing director of Cremal which runs the crematorium, told Lusa news agency. Construction started in April 2019. The investment of over €600,000 was completely covered by Cremal, the company that will manage the crematorium for the next 30 years.
