Construction has begun on **West Herts Crematorium**. A ground-breaking ceremony, held at the new site on Tuesday 1 March, was attended by members of the **West Herts Crematorium Joint Committee** and Council leaders, all representing the five local authorities involved in delivering the project. This new facility will be a sister-site to the current West Herts Crematorium in Garston, Watford and is being developed to provide additional capacity in the West Hertfordshire region. Construction is expected to be completed by Feb/March 2023. For more details on this story please visit <u>Watford</u> <u>Borough Council</u>.

An official naming ceremony has been held at a new crematorium near **Thirsk**. The multimillion-pound, **Hambleton District Council**-led development which has been named Maple Park in memory of the members of the Royal Canadian Airforce who lost their lives in the area during WW2, is now complete, and will open for ceremonies in March. The 22acre site which features a revolutionary electric cremator to reduce emissions, is close to both the A1 and A19 and includes a service hall to accommodate approximately 120 mourners plus additional room for standing. The site also features 98 maple trees, planted to commemorate the bombers lost in operations flown from nearby RAF Skipton-on-Swale. To read the full article please visit the <u>York Mix</u>.

A retired businessman has launched a petition urging **BCP Council** to install a working cremator at **Poole Crematorium**. The local authority is spending £559,000 refurbishing the facility at Gravel Hill, but the phase one refurbishments do not include a cremator. Bodies are currently transported across to Bournemouth Crematorium after the funeral service. Tony Reeves, who lives in Broadstone, said he believes families want their loved ones cremated at the same place where the committal occurs. Phase one of work at Poole Crematorium is due to start this month and will see the Gravel Hill site closed to services for 22 weeks. The council has not yet made a decision on whether an investment in a new cremator will be included in phase two of the project. This is likely to be discussed by councillors later this year. Horizon Ceremonies' plans for a new crematorium in Hooton were delayed this week after the proposal was removed from the agenda at a meeting of Cheshire West and Chester Council's Planning Committee. In response to the removal of the proposal, Cheshire West and Chester Council said "The application was withdrawn from the planning committee agenda after the Council became aware of submission of a separate planning application for another crematorium development on land nearby. We have withdrawn the original application because there is not enough time for it to be considered. It may be several weeks before that application is processed and available to view online." A further £800,000 will be spent on making Yeovil Crematorium, Somerset, fit for purpose for at least the next 25 years. The original decision to refurbish and upgrade the facility was taken back in June 2017, with the council intending to construct a new chapel, waiting room, a smaller secondary chapel and improved parking facilities, as well as replacing the existing cremators. By March 2020, one of the two replacement cremators had been installed, but the installer went into liquidation, and the new cremator installed had "mercury abatement issues". The contract for the main construction element was not ultimately taken forward due to "operational pressures" during the first coronavirus lockdown. The funding proposals will come before the full council for final approval as part of its annual budget-setting meeting on February 28. An Angus farmer is appealing the decision to block his bid for a crematorium in the countryside north of **Dundee**. A delegated refusal for the proposal on land near Murroes followed a 16-month fight by locals against Friockheim family firm **FM&G Batchelor**'s scheme for the site north of Duntrune House. Planners rejected it because they said it breached local and national policy. Farmer Guthrie Batchelor will now see his bid go before councillors in an attempt to overturn the officials' refusal. Lawyers for applicant Duntrune Ltd say the refusal decision should be overturned because it meets development plan policies. There were more than 750 letters of objection submitted to the council. But Mr Batchelor says many were in a standard form generated by a "targeted and concerted campaign" of opposition. For more information please visit **The Courier**

A new bereavement support service launches in Edinburgh

Times are extremely hard for many now, especially those who have lost someone during the last two years. The mental health of the bereaved has particularly suffered during these uncertain times, so a not-for-profit funeral director has launched **Caledonia Funeral Aid** which aims to provide an extra support system for recently bereaved people in Edinburgh. Caledonia Funeral Aid is an extension of the work of Caledonia Cremation – a social enterprise funeral directors set up to fight funeral poverty by offering not-for-profit cremations. Since their inception in 2018, they have been supporting Scots facing the additional stress of not being able to afford a funeral. During that time, the social enterprise found the support required wasn't just financial, but practical and emotional too. So, they have extended their offer by launching Caledonia Funeral Aid.

Co-founder John Halliday explains more: "We have learnt that just providing a not-forprofit funeral wasn't enough – people needed more. By setting up Caledonia Funeral Aidwe will provide full emotional and practical support to the recently bereaved. We will provide a trained coach and funeral support worker to help Edinburgh residents who have experienced a bereavement in the past 6 months. This support will focus on their emotional needs. We will deeply listen to their needs and give them a safe and trusted place in which to discuss their loss and the impact on their lives. We are delighted to launch this initially in Edinburgh, thanks to funding from Edinburgh Community Mental Health and Wellbeing Fund. However, our aim is to launch this nationwide very shortly."
