

#### **CREMATORIA NEWS**

East Yorkshire's new crematorium is set to open in January, with a manager and deputy manager already appointed. The crematorium will be located off Lelley Road in Preston and although it received planning permission last year, concerns about its impact on local traffic remain. East Riding Council's environment and climate change portfolio holder Cllr Chris Matthews promised that council officers would work with residents on what mitigation measures can be introduced to lessen the effect of the crematorium on traffic. Cllr Matthews issued an update on the crematorium at the full council meeting. The project is being managed by StreetScene Services and Kier were awarded the £9.6m construction contract in October 2021. He confirmed that the aim is for the crematorium to be open in January 2023. For more details, please visit the <u>Hull Live website</u>.

A new crematorium has opened near Thirsk. The multi-million pound, council-led development has been named Maple Park in memory of the members of the Royal Canadian Airforce who sadly lost their lives in the area during WW2. The 22-acre site which features a revolutionary electric cremator to reduce emissions and therefore the area's carbon footprint, is close to both the A1 and A19 and includes a service hall to accommodate approximately 120 mourners plus additional room for standing. There is also an entrance foyer, waiting lobby, offices and a family room. As well as this, the single storey facility includes a wake facility and café, which is set to open soon, with beautiful views out over the Hambleton hills. The site also offers a memorial garden, meadows and a wooded area making it a calm and peaceful place for reflection or for scattering ashes. A digital book of remembrance which is the first in North Yorkshire is also available, enabling families to create, edit and publish final messages for their loved ones. The site poignantly also features 98 maple trees, planted to commemorate the bombers lost in operations flown from nearby RAF Skipton-on-Swale. For more details please visit: The York Press.



#### **CREMATORIA NEWS**

Mourners are promised a "peaceful" local place to say goodbye to their loved ones as the New Forest Crematorium opens in New Milton. The single-chapel development sits within 11 acres off Stem Lane and Great Woar Copse and is run by the Westerleigh Group, the UK's second largest crematorium operator. Capable of hosting up to 48 services per week, the facility will serve those from New Milton, Christchurch, Bournemouth and surrounding areas. There is seating for 117, with further standing space and provision for larger gatherings to witness services from outside as well as webcasts. There are 104 parking spaces. Personalised religious or non-religious services can be held, with specialist provision including a choice of hearse, such as vintage, horse drawn or even motorcycle. Hooton Paddocks have submitted updated plans for a development on School Lane in the latest move in the saga over a new crematorium in Hooton. At a planning meeting for Cheshire West and Chester Council, rival developer Horizon's proposal was withdrawn from the discussion with the Council citing the "submission of a separate application for another crematorium development on land nearby." The new plans retain the original design of the Hooton Paddocks model, but have been submitted on behalf of the family business, by an independent town planning consultancy firm Emery Planning, who have offices in both Chester and Macclesfield. The proposal, outlined by designer LHC Design, says that the site will be located between the villages of Hooton and Childer Thornton and that a single storey dwelling and a large equestrian stable block will make way for "a new, high-quality crematorium with associated parking and landscaping will be provided on the site." Currently, families from Ellesmere Port and South Wirral have to travel to Landican or Blacon for cremation services, with the former reported to be the fifth busiest crematorium in the country, with an average of 3200 funerals each year. ## Ministry of Justice - Medical examiner scheme: update on cremation regulations and retention of medical referees for transitionary period

The Ministry of Justice has provided an update on the planned changes to the cremation regulations as part of the wider implementation of the medical examiner scheme:-

'We previously informed you that secondary legislation had been laid in Parliament to remove form Cremation 5. This legislation came into effect on 25 March 2022 and form Cremation 5 has been removed on a permanent basis.

As you are aware, the medical examiner scheme has been rolled out on a non-statutory basis to all acute settings, and is in the process of being rolled out across non-acute settings. The Government is working towards implementing the statutory medical examiner system from April 2023.

As set out in the 2016 consultation on the Introduction of medical examiners and reforms to death certification in England and Wales, the scrutiny provided by the statutory medical examiners will replace the current arrangements for completing form Cremation 4. We therefore intend to remove the requirement to complete form Cremation 4 when the statutory medical examiner scheme is in place in all settings. We will provide updates to the funeral sector as the implementation of the statutory medical examiner scheme progresses and we move to remove form Cremation 4 in legislation.

The consultation also set out the intention to remove medical referees upon implementation of the statutory medical examiner scheme. We recognise that there is concern from crematoria and from within the funeral sector that new processes will need to be developed and that at least six months' notice will be needed to implement any changes associated with medical referees. We will also liaise with crematoria and the funeral sector for their help on new cremation guidance. In light of the lead in time required to implement the new processes, we have taken the decision to retain medical referees for a transitionary period once the statutory medical examiner scheme has been implemented to ensure continuity and any required process changes are identified. We will give sufficient time to enable the medical examiner scheme to be fully established and we will work with the funeral sector before removing the role of the medical referee. This will ensure that everyone within the sector is ready for the forthcoming changes.

We will provide updates on the roll out of the medical examiner scheme when they are available.'



## **National Medical Examiner 2021 Report**

Dr Alan Fletcher, National Medical Examiner, has published his latest report. The report details the progress made to date, together with focusing on the next steps to introducing case management systems and processes so that all non-coronial deaths receive independent scrutiny, whether or not the death occurred in a hospital setting. It also reports that Royal Assent for the Health and Care Bill clears the way for the medical examiner system to become a statutory part of death certification processes.

# **Scottish Government Funeral Sector Inspectorate and Funeral Director Licensing Scheme**

The Scottish Government is progressing implementation of the Burial and Cremation (Scotland) Act 2016 and the related regulations, codes of practice and guidance which will impact the funeral sector.

A key part of this is establishing the Funeral Sector Inspectorate. The Burial and Cremation Team is requesting that all those working in the funeral sector in Scotland sign up now and provide your business/organisation name, address and email contact details as well as which category of organisation/ business:

- Funeral director,
- · Burial authority,
- · Cremation authority,
- Other.

While some have previously signed up to receive the team's blog, the legal basis for requesting and retaining your information has been updated. Please look out for a postcard requesting you to provide some information about your business.

You are being asked to agree to the team retaining that information for the purposes of establishing a database of the funeral sector and to provide you with the important updates about progress of the inspectorate and licensing. The revised privacy notice can be read at:
