COVID-19 - UPDATE

Deceased Management Advisory Group



There have been a number of updates in guidance issued since our last news review and some of the more significant updates issued are listed below:-

- 22.10.2020 Northern Ireland's Department of Health issues updated '<u>Guidance for</u> <u>handling the infection risks when caring for the deceased and managing funerals'</u> during the period of restrictions effective from 16th October 2020
- 19.10.2020 Scottish Government issues <u>request to Scottish crematoria to stop the use of</u> <u>outside speakers</u>
- 14.10.2020 Northern Ireland Executive <u>tightens restrictions to curb COVID-19</u> includes funerals to be limited to 25 people with no pre- or post-funeral gatherings
- 12.10.2020 Local COVID alert level VERY HIGH restrictions <u>guidance</u> including guidance for religious services and funerals
- 12.10.2020 Local COVID alert level HIGH restrictions <u>guidance</u> including guidance for religious services and funerals
- 12.10.2020 Local COVID alert level MEDIUM restrictions <u>guidance</u> including guidance for religious services and funerals
- 07.10.2020 Scottish Government issues updated guidance on <u>'Carrying The Cords And</u> <u>Coffin'</u>

CREMATORIA NEWS

The planning application for a crematorium in **Oxted** has been refused. The proposal from developers, **Horizon Cremation**, was to build a crematorium on a Green Belt field at the junction of Barrow Green Road and the A25, but was refused by **Tandridge District Council**. Pure Cremation's Charlton Park Crematorium, has broken the UK record for cremations carried out in the first year of operation. The crematorium, located in the beautiful Hampshire countryside near Andover, carried out 2,380 cremations since January 2019, with the previous highest figure being 1,462 for South Leicestershire Crematorium in Counteshorpe in 2016. Catherine Powell, who co-founded Pure Cremation with her husband Bryan, said: "Mourners and our funeral colleagues can rest assured that the deceased is being cared for at an innovative, well-run facility in beautiful surroundings and with exceptional customer service." Plans submitted to **Dacorum Borough Council** for the construction of a new crematorium in **Hemel Hempstead**, have been approved by the Council's planning committee. The plans submitted by **West Herts Crematorium Joint Committee**, which comprises of councillors from five constituent authorities – Three Rivers District Council, Dacorum Borough Council, Hertsmere Borough Council, St Albans City & District Council and Watford Borough Council - have now been referred to the Ministry for Housing, Communities and Local Government. CREMATORIA NEWS

Contractors have been appointed for the construction of **Hambleton**'s new crematorium. Contractor, Willmott Dixon, will begin work on the site on the outskirts of Thirsk in the first week of November. The multi-million-pound **Hambleton District Council** project will feature a revolutionary electric cremator to reduce emissions. Leader of Hambleton District Council, Councillor Mark Robson, said: "I'm delighted we are getting this much needed and significant development underway in November". A £3.4 million modernisation of **St Helens Crematorium** has been approved. The announcement comes after the council's Bereavement Service team was recognised at a national level, securing a Silver in the nationwide Cemetery of the Year Awards. St Helens Council wants to build on this success and achievements of the service with a multi-million-pound investment in the building and completely revitalise facilities to a modern standard. The ambition for the project is a full refurbishment of the crematorium building, "in a cohesive, modern and respectful style". You can read more in the <u>St Helens Star article</u>.

Plans have been announced for a new crematorium and memorial garden to be built in **Woodhatch**. The plans for the crematorium show a modern and discreet building, set in a landscaped garden of remembrance that complements the surrounding landscape. **Reigate & Banstead Borough Council** is planning an online consultation event on Thursday 29 October at 6.30pm via Zoom. Residents will hear from the Design Team about the proposed development and will be able to ask questions. CREMATORIA NEWS

Developers have been successful in an appeal against a decision by **Arun District Council** to reject plans for a crematorium at **Yapton**. The appeal decision ruled that the appeal should be allowed and granted planning permission to developers, **Landlink Estates**, for a single chapel crematorium, with car parking, landscape works, surface water drainage features and associated highway improvements. REPUBLIC OF IRELAND NEWS

Planning permission is being sought for the construction of a crematorium near **Castleblayney**. The single storey building, including a chapel of rest, would be built adjacent to and within the same complex as a previously approved pet crematorium building in Broomfield. The planning statement notes that the applicant, Olive Cunningham, wishes to erect a pet crematorium and a human crematorium as "an overall integral development operated as one". Donegal County Council has refused permission for a proposed crematorium in Monclink, Manorcunningham. The Council finding said that there is a need for such services, and in principle, the general area is suitable for such a development. However, the site was determined not to be suitable, with the council saying it was not compatible with local industry and dwellings. 
INTERNATIONAL NEWS

The number of people choosing to have their body sent overseas for cremation has increased in the past year, according to a leading funeral company that plans to build **Malta**'s first crematorium. In May 2019, a landmark piece of legislation was approved in parliament, allowing cremation services to be offered on the island for the first time. More than a year later, there are still no crematoria operating in the country, but the passage of the law appears to have prompted a rethink in some people about what to do with their bodies when they die.
