Highland Council's planned £1.2m upgrade to the crematorium at Kilvean Cemetery gets the green light

The £1.2 million pound upgrade of Inverness's crematorium to ensure it is fit for purpose into the future has cleared a major hurdle after securing planning permission. The proposal, which will see modern cremation ovens replace the existing facilities at Kilvean Cemetery - as well as works to extend the building and plant enclosure - were recently given the green light by council officers under delegated powers. The council's communities and place committee heard last month how the new cremation ovens were vital in order to ensure the crematorium remained fully functional. Members heard how the need to replace the existing cremators had become necessary due to the planned introduction of stricter emissions standards by 2027 and the collapse of the company which made the existing facilities - the latter of which posed "long-term reliability" risks for the current plant when it comes to ongoing maintenance and support. The two new Facultatieve Technologies III SE cremators, are expected to be installed by Morrison Construction contractors, with work on site beginning in November. The extension is expected to be wind and watertight by March, when the existing Cremator 1 will be removed. Its replacement will follow, with work on that expected to be finished within 10 weeks. Cremator 2 will then also be removed in July of next year, with its replacement expected to have been installed by that September. Facultatieve Technologies is then expected to handover the completed cremators that same month. The staggered approach to the work will ensure the crematorium can continue to operate throughout the upgrade. The new cremators are part of wider efforts to extend the cemetery's life, with the council also recently pursuing plans to increase the number of available burial plots by a further 1,830 - ensuring the site can remain operational until at least 2066. The project was granted planning permission subject to a number of conditions, including one to ensure local populations of the protected Great Crested Newt are protected during construction. Five-year Angus crematorium battle back at Court of Session next month


A farmer's five-year fight to secure permission for a new Angus crematorium will return to Scotland's highest civil court next month. Guthrie Batchelor first lodged plans for the site at Duntrune, on the Angus Council border with Dundee, in November 2020. The Duntrune proposal triggered massive local opposition. In 2023, Mr Batchelor secured the green light for the project. At that time, Angus planning review councillors overturned a 2021 decision by officers to block the scheme. But local objector Paul Dixon challenged the appeal committee's decision in the Court of Session. The authority did not contest Mr Dixon's assertion the Duntrune decision was unlawful. It led the court to order the council to constitute a new appeal committee to consider the application. However, it also granted conditional approval for the greenfield site in August 2024. Mr Batchelor was set to progress the crematorium build until a second court challenge was mounted by Mr Dixon at the end of last year. He sought a statutory review of the second appeal outcome. Court of Session rolls reveal Mr Dixon's case against Angus Council is scheduled to be heard next month. It will call in Edinburgh on Wednesday October 15th. The matter is due to be heard before the Lord President, Lord Pentland, and fellow judges Lord Doherty and Lord Ericht. To read the full article, head to: www.thecourier.co.uk

Gornal Wood Crematorium refurbishment in Dudley now complete

More mourners will be able to attend funerals at a crematorium thanks to a £1.1 million refurbishment. The seating capacity at the chapel at Gornal Wood Crematorium has increased from 90 to 120, while a host of other improvement works have been completed. The crematorium reopened at the start of the month and has since hosted more than 70 funerals. Other work to the chapel included the installation of air conditioning and improved heating; new carpets, lectern, furniture and seating; an upgraded music media system; renovation to the toilets and the installation of another fire door. The toilets now have level access and are wheelchair friendly, and a disabled access ramp has been added to the external access area for the waiting room. The wreath terrace – where floral tributes are placed after a funeral service – has been resurfaced, as has the footpath and area outside the front of the chapel. 
A FUNERAL business is set to unveil the results of a £350,000 refurbishment project.

The work has been carried out at Hammerwich Crematorium and Cemetery previously known as Chase and District Memorial Park – after it was acquired by AW Lymm last year. The improvements have included facilities upgrades to the chapel, air conditioning, audio and visual system and groundswork as part of what the company says will be a "first major step" in transforming the site. Pete Clarson, commercial director at AW Lymn, said: "We're really pleased to report that since acquiring Hammerwich, the number of cremations being conducted here has already doubled – and that's before our refurbishment works have been completed. It is wonderful to see Hammerwich Crematorium and Cemetery undergoing such a transformation. Our investment reflects our commitment to providing families with dignified, comfortable surroundings capable of modern and traditional services and we look forward to welcoming people into the improved setting very soon." Work is also being undertaken to increase the amount of car parking space at the Burntwood Way site from 19 spaces to 52. Hammerwich Crematorium and Cemetery manager Jane Baker said: "It's incredibly exciting to witness this level of care and investment being brought into the site. AW Lymn's vision for Hammerwich aligns perfectly with our hopes for the future and the improvements already taking shape show just how committed our new owners are to local families." - the preparation for the death certification reforms
- implementation of the reforms and their impact
- feedback around MCCDs and the timeline between death and registration
- updates on the work carried out to improve the issues surrounding information on the removal of hazardous implantable medical devices
- ongoing training and funding of medical examiner offices.
