

CREMATORIA NEWS

A new crematorium aimed to help cope with a “growing and urgent” need for new facilities in Essex has been given the go-ahead by councillors. Plans for a new crematorium opposite St Margaret’s Church, at **Woodham Mortimer**, were approved by Maldon District Council’s northern western area planning committee. A representative of applicant **Maldon Fields Ltd** said the nearest facilities in Chelmsford and Colchester are at capacity and that the crematorium would work closely with local funeral directors and clergy. The proposals themselves would consist of a two-storey crematorium building with a ceremonial hall, memorial garden and access from the A414, according to a Maldon District Council report. Cooper’s Monument, in Maldon Road near the site, will also be restored as part of the proposals. The crematorium is intended to host four services a day, outside of peak traffic hours. Planned upgrades to **Yeovil Crematorium** have been pushed back by at least a year. **South Somerset District Council** is the public body responsible for Yeovil Crematorium on Bunford Lane in Yeovil, which currently averages 1,700 cremations per year. The council has aimed for several years to upgrade the facility, which was completed in 1970, to provide more room for mourners and to enable the building to handle more services. Now the majority of the upgrades have been pushed back until 2024 as the new unitary council - which officially takes charge on April 1st - attempts to balance its books. **Councillor Colin Rose**, vice-chairman of Yeovil Without Parish Council, complained about the lack of local consultation on the project and questioned whether the project would ultimately be abandoned. He went on to say: "What the population of South Somerset needs is a modern facility, a facility of dignity to say farewell to loved ones - and not a facility where, when there is a large turnout, a lot of those in attendance have to stand outside in the waiting room because they can't get inside the existing chapel." Council leader **Val Keitch** - who sits on the cabinet of the new unitary authority - gave assurances that she and other South Somerset councillors would push for the crematorium upgrades to be continued. Work is underway on an eco-friendly upgrade of **Accrington Cemetery and Crematorium**. **Hyndburn Council**'s current depot facilities at the **Burnley Road site** are more than 40 years old and in need of modernisation. The improvements will enable cemetery staff to continue to provide an important frontline service but with an eye to the future and running the service in a more carbon neutral way. **Cllr Steven Smithson**, Hyndburn Council's environment boss, said: "It is really exciting to see the new eco-friendly buildings starting to take shape at the Burnley Road Cemetery. The much-needed modernisation and improvement of the facilities will be warmly welcomed by our cemetery and crematorium staff, as well as enabling the borough to meet its important energy efficiency targets. A £9.6m state-of-the-art crematorium in East Yorkshire has opened. **Lelley Fields Crematorium** in **Holderness** is the first crematorium to open in the region in 25 years and was opened by Councillor John Whittle on 21st February. Work on the facility off Sproatley Road, near Preston, which is being run by East Riding of Yorkshire Council, began at the end of 2021. A spokesperson for the council said it would offer relatives and friends "a peaceful and tranquil place to commemorate their loved ones". Kier Construction had worked alongside the council's building design team to deliver the project. The last crematorium to open in the area was the privately-run Haltemprice Crematorium which started operating in 1998. To read the full article, please visit: [the BBC news website.](#)

A final ruling on rejected plans for a new **Angus crematorium** has been delayed again. Plans for what would be the second crematorium in Angus first emerged more than two years ago. The **Friockheim** family business wants to build a 120-seat crematorium with memorial garden and parking on farmland near the border with **Dundee**. But there were more than 700 objections to the plan, and in January last year the proposal was knocked back by the Angus planning department in a delegated decision. Mr Batchelor appealed the outcome to the council's development management review committee. There was a further delay after objectors uncovered "serious flaws" in a planning report. In December the appeal was hit by another hold up when the review committee said they needed to carry out a site visit, which took place in January. Now councillors want further information about the proposal's possible conflict with Scotland's new planning framework, by which planning applications will be judged on for the next decade. 
